#### **Christian Aid:**

- Firstly, thank you to everyone who helped make this year's Lent Lunches for Christian Aid such a success. It was lovely to see so many people enjoying getting together again. We had many positive comments.
- Thanks to your efforts and some very generous donations the final total is £4,856. This includes sales of quizzes and donations specifically to the lunches and, as an example, is enough to provide 65 families with an emergency food kit, providing essential nutrition for a month. In Afganistan, for example, this consists of wheat flour, local rice, vegetable oil, pulses, salt and sugar.
- Secondly, as last year we will be holding a coffee morning on Saturday 13th May 10-12 at the Usual Place to mark Christian Aid Week.
